# Chinese Art: Inheritance & Innovation 🄭

The Welcome Swallow Gallery is extremely proud to present an exhibition featuring art that is inspired by Chinese history and traditions. Throughout Chinese history, the practice of art is first learned by rote, in which the master shows the "right way" to draw. Every generation of new artists is encouraged to demonstrate mastery of continuous brush strokes and movement until it becomes instinctive.

However, in contemporary times, debates have established the limits of this tradition. Within modern art scenes, innovation is now more the rule. As with Western traditions, changing lifestyles, tools, and colors are also influenced by new waves of master painters.

This exhibition spans these artistic canons. Several of **Yong Ming Liu's** exquisite watercolours scrolls are based on his interpretation of masters that were painting during the Ming Dynasty some 650 years ago. This is seen in his superb composition, *Horseback Riding into the Spring Mountains*. Conversely, *Playing the Flute on the Autumn Water*, shows Yong Ming's personal imprimatur in terms of the composition of the painting, colours used and details added, such as trees, rocks and water.

His daughter, **Jing Liu**, while inheriting many of the Chinese artistic methods and traditions, explores innovative representations in art that include mixing sketching on rice paper with traditional Chinese watercolours. This method can be seen in the evocative composition, *Alice.* whereas a claborate or realist style is evident in the paintings *Flying Apsaras* and *Light Fragrance.* Both represent a state of peace and calm.

The paintings by Dejin Lu present a Chinese light expressive style known as Xieyi that requires a deft and delicate use of watercolours and when required, a careful balance between water and ink, a style inherited from past generations. This is represented in the painting Poetic Feeling of Fallen Flower. His compositional work also acts as a hybrid with New Zealandbased subject matter. The result is an innovative impressionistic rendering of familiar subjects to a New Zealand audience that can be seen in Spring Magnolia & Kereru.

All three exhibition artists are firmly anchored in the three Chinese taxonomic themes; Flower and Birds; Landscapes, and Figures. In this exhibition we have a wonderful opportunity to view this world through their eyes. We move from inheritance of traditions to innovations in method, form and content.

As you browse through this catalogue, we encourage you to enjoy these art pieces in the comfort of your own surroundings. The artists and the cause are well worth your investment.

## The Exhibition Artists



Yong Ming Liu

Based in China, Yong Ming Liu is a self-taught artist. He is the father of Jing Liu, who is also a self-taught artist based in Hamilton New Zealand. Yong Ming has a passion for the claborate style of landscape watercolour painting that is a Chinese tradition. He is also fond of Chinese calligraphy. All the calligraphy on his artworks are written by himself. In his spare time and in the morning, Yong Ming enjoys practising martial arts. His favourite form is Xing Yi Quan that is based on twelve animal forms. He also likes Ba Gua Zhang, which is called the *Eight Fixed Palms* routines.





## Jing Liu

Jing Liu was born and bred in Beijing China and is now living with her family in New Zealand. Ever since she was a child, she loved drawing and painting; a state of mind that allows her to creatively express herself and communicate with the world.

Being a self-taught artist, she sketching and likes the claborate style of the traditional Chinese watercolour painting the most, and enjoys using lines, shapes, colours, light and shadow to create an illusion of feelings and emotions for audiences. She also enjoys experimenting with different drawing ideas, such as combining sketching and Chinese watercolour while working on both sides of rice papers to create a subtle and interesting visual look.



## Dejin Lu

Dejin Lü (AKA Dejin water ink) was born in Nanjing, China. He has shown huge passion for traditional Chinese water ink painting, one of the oldest continuous artistic traditions in the world. Like calligraphy, it is bamboo brush done with dipped in black ink or coloured pigments, usually on rice paper or silk. Lines are used not only to draw contours but also to express the artist's concepts and feelings. The use of lines and strokes is one of the elements that give Chinese water ink painting its unique qualities.

Inspired by nature, Dejin mainly does freehand style of Bird & Flower (or Flora & Fauna), one of the 3 categories of Chinese water ink painting. In 2005, Dejin started study in Nanjing University and he graduated in 2009 with bachelors degree in Biological Science. In 2011, Dejin moved to New Zealand.

Since then, Dejin has started learning the unique Flora & Fauna in New Zealand and publishing articles to introduce them in Chinese magazines of China Nature and Life World. has Dejin also started exploring them in his paintings, trying to achieve "something between likeness & unlikeness".
