“It’s all in the mind...”

We start our second year in the Gallery with a theme that resides at the opposite end of the art spectrum from our previous exhibitions. To date, form and composition have typically reflected the subject matter that is evident in the greater New Zealand grand narrative. Majestic landscapes, flora and fauna have been fabulously represented in many different styles and genres.

To introduce the artists featured in this exhibition, we open the imagination towards the unknown, the realm of personal insight. Abstract compositions invite multiple meanings that defy stable categorization. Situated between the work of Wassily Kandinsky and Helen Frankenthaler, **Hannah Goodwin** presents delicious cacophonies of colour that shed references to traditional forms, while retaining immediate magnetic appeal.

Although noted for his famous ‘drip paintings’, Jackson Pollock also experimented with vivid, bold gestural architecture, as seen in his 1943 *Mural* composition. **Kirsty Black’s** art strongly echoes this abstract form while exhibiting greater visual freedom, as seen in her Diptych offering, *Midnight Conga* that portrays a dizzying swirl of heady momentum. Get in line!

Toni Kingstone’s resin compositions channel Bruce Riley’s work in that she encourages the flow of paint in novel

and unknown directions. The result is a stunning display that takes the observer into the luxurious landscapes of untrammelled imagination.

As an established conceptual artist, **Kate Wilson’s** work has graced the Gallery on several occasions. Taking her inspiration from the likes of Salvador Dali, Kate’s art converts a concept to a visual medium, placing it on canvas. Similar to Frida Kahlo, Kate’s paintings are rich with symbolic imagery - sometimes blatant, sometimes discrete.

Finally, **Marise Rarere** combines the intersecting lines extant in Piet Mondrian’s, 1930 *Red, Yellow and Blue* work with Ellsworth Kelly’s 1951 *Colours for a large wall*. Her artistic narrative dazzles, demanding either a concentrated eye or a larger view of canvas that with no singular point of vision, relaxes and calms.

We are delighted to be able to show these works of art and in so doing, with a stunning visual feast, we broaden the horizons that the *Welcome Swallow Gallery* has heretofore represented.

As you browse through this catalogue, we encourage you to enjoy these art pieces in the comfort of your own surroundings. Both the artists and the cause are well worth your investment.

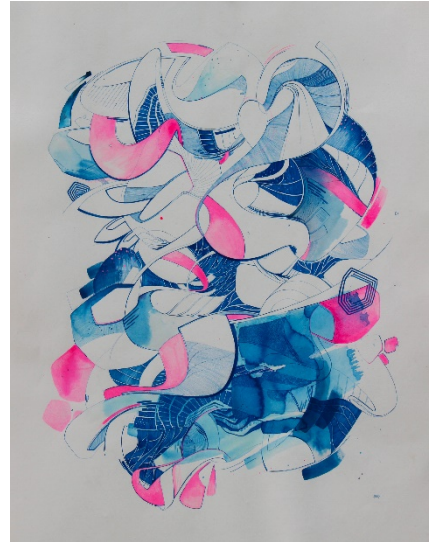

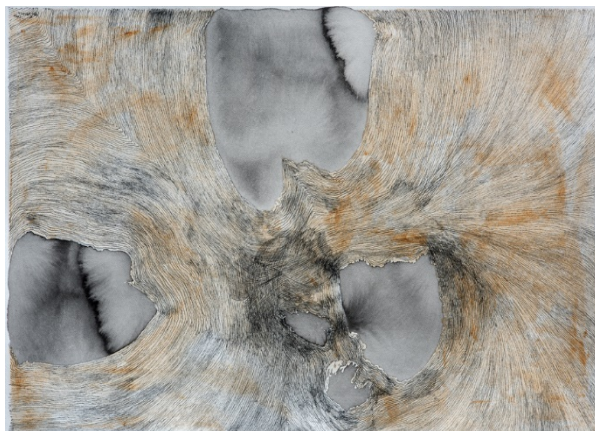

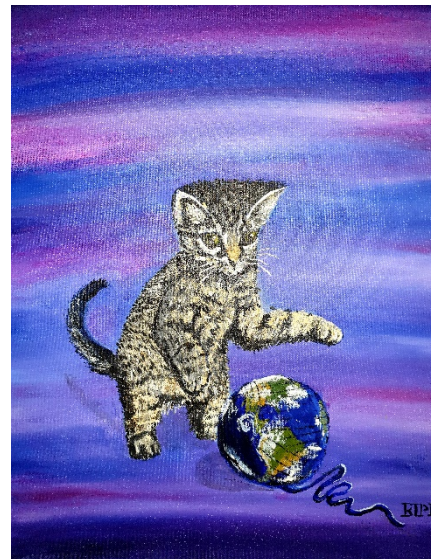

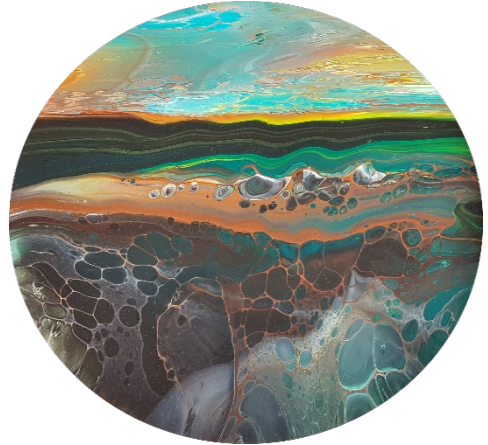

The Exhibition Artists



Hannah Goodwin

Growing up I had an interest in both drawing and digital art. In 2011, after completing a Bachelor of Media Arts from Wintec I began working as a Graphic Designer and my personal art practice began to veer away from the representational towards the abstract.

Creating abstract work allows me the freedom to create without the constraint of trying to anticipate or direct how a potential viewer might respond. Composition ambiguity allows the viewer space to arrive at their own interpretation or simply just to take in on an aesthetic level.

My current work is focused on exploring the interplay of colour, marks and pattern, often with the layering drawn together with painted elements.



Kirsty Black

I aim to create joyful works that engage the viewer, leading them on a journey of individual interpretation.

The first step in starting a new work is intuitive. The freedom of the initial gestural sweep of colour and vigorous brush work provides the framework. Shapes and movement reveal themselves, transporting me into a colourful world of invented narrative. In much the same way cloud gazing prompts a story or daydreaming allows the mind to meander, the development of the artwork in front of me sparks my imagination and a story unfolds.

Kate Wilson

Kate Wilson is a conceptual artist based in Hamilton

Overall Kate's art is around achieving personal catharsis through converting a concept to a visual medium and placing it on canvas. Her paintings demand attention and time. The viewer will find plenty of opportunity to construct their own insights that will test the boundaries of personal reflection.

Her hope is that viewers enjoy the painting as a whole, but also become intrigued by the various moving parts to the painting and the challenge that has been placed before them.

This is also why she enjoys performing commissions. Her sign-off KTPI is phonetic for "I feel fine" in Maori which is a nice way to finish off a work.

I live and make my art work from home in Whale Bay, Raglan.

These compositions are a selection of recently made pieces that express a range of ideas exploring perception, time, energy.

Some are contemplative, calm while communicating a sense of slowness. Others catch a few moments in time.

I am particularly enjoying the freedom of abstract work, with the excitement and uncertainty that comes from being led by the flow of the creative process rather than taking a meticulous approach.

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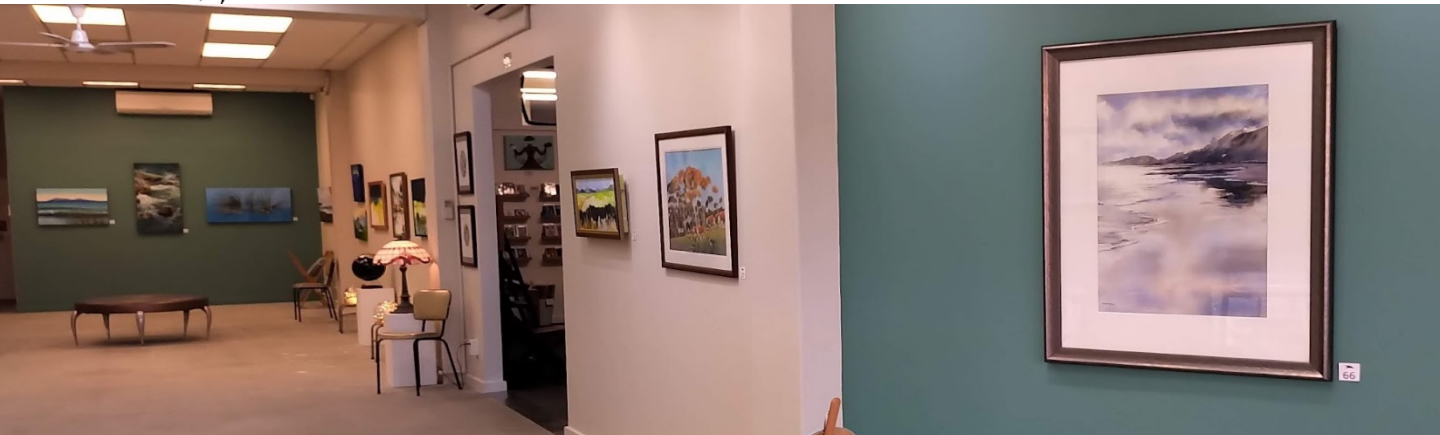


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
